INTEREST HIGH IN PRIDE AWARDS PROGRAM

One hundred and fifteen communities were enrolled in the 1973 awards phase of the PRIDE Program by the cut-off date. This is an increase of 30 over last year. Project books (11" x 18") will be sent to each enrolled community. Prize money will be awarded to communities on the basis of:

1. Statement of Community Goals,
2. Awareness,
3. Involvement, and
4. Degree of Accomplishment.

The project or record books must be sent to Kansas Department of Economic Development by September 1, 1973.
