## Water Conservation Application Deadline Is Extended

The deadline for entering the PRIDE Water Conservation competition has been extended to March 1, 1990, due to the significant amount of interest that has been generated from PRIDE communities. The purpose of this special program emphasis is to encourage Kansas PRIDE communities to begin implementing long-term water conservation practices.

Each community desiring to participate in the water conservation competition must send a letter by March 1, 1990, which indicates what water conservation practices it plans to implement. The letter should be sent to Beverly Wilhelm, Kansas PRIDE, Inc., Department of Commerce, 400 West 8th Street, Topeka, Kansas 66603-3957. Technical assistance is available from the Kansas Water Office in Topeka. The telephone number to call is (913) 296-3185. Also, water conservation ideas can be obtained from your local county Extension agent.

Personnel from the Kansas Water Office will be meeting with representatives from each participating PRIDE community during the month of February. Those communities participating include: Formoso, Jennings, Kensington, Oberlin, Phillipsburg, Russell, Hoisington, Quinter, Grinnell, Goodland, Sharon Springs, Dodge City, Potwin, Kingman, Haviland, Kinsley, Spearville, Elkhart, Rossville, and Ottawa.

## Telenet to Focus on How We Market Our Community

"How We Market Our Community" is the title of a statewide TELENET conference to be held Friday, February 2, from 12 noon to 1:30 p.m. This conference will be held at TELENET sites across Kansas.

The main purpose of the conference is to stimulate PRIDE leaders, other community leaders, and decision-makers with success stories presented by five community groups. Each rural community group

will present an account of how they are marketing their town to shoppers, travelers, tourists, and potential retirees. The special value of this program will be in the community-to-community sharing of good ideas. A question-and-answer session is included in the 1 1/2 hour program.

## Clues To Rural Community Survival

The following list of indicators, as developed by the Heartland Center for Leadership Development, Lincoln, Nebraska, is an excellent tool to measure the survivability of communities as the twenty-first century approaches:

- Evidence of community pride
- Emphasis on quality in business and community life
- Willingness to invest in the future
- Participatory approach to community decision making
- Cooperative community spirit
- Realistic appraisal of future opportunities
- Awareness of competitive positioning
- Knowledge of the physical environment
- Active economic development program
- Deliberate transition of power to a younger generation of leaders

Also included are:

- Acceptance of women in leadership roles
- Strong belief in and support for education
- Problem-solving approach to providing health care
- Strong multi-generational family orientation
- Strong presence of traditional institutions that are integral to community life
- Attention to a sound and well-maintained infrastructure
- Careful use of fiscal resources
- Sophisticated use of information resources
- Willingness to seek help from the outside
- Conviction that, in the long run, you have to do it yourself.

## State PRIDE Board Elects Officers

Members of the State PRIDE Board of Directors elected Ross Marsh as their 1990 chairperson. Ross is Director of Operations-Kansas for United Telephone Company, which serves nearly 100,000 customers in Kansas, Nebraska, and Wyoming, with headquarters in Junction City.

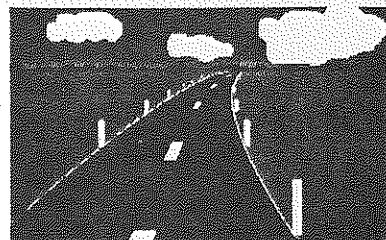

## Adopt A Highway Program is Now Underway

Horace Edwards, Secretary of the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT), announced on December 18, 1989, the creation of the new "Adopt A Highway Program."

The purpose of this program is to make the state's roadways litter free. The program is designed for non-profit organizations. The adopting group will assume responsibility for an assigned section of highway to pick up litter and trash. The group will clean its road section at least three times a year for a two-year period. KDOT will work with the adopting group to select the section of highway to be adopted.

Governor Mike Hayden endorsed



this new program by stating, "I wholeheartedly support those Kansans who participate by adopting a section of highway to help keep this great state clean."

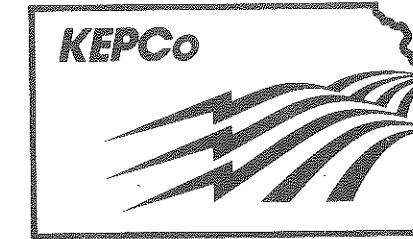

# Kansas Electric Power Cooperative, Inc., Is New PRIDE Sponsor

Please welcome our new PRIDE sponsor, the Kansas Electric Power Cooperative, Inc. (KEPCo).

KEPCo is the wholesale power supplier to 24 rural electric cooperatives operating in the eastern two-thirds of Kansas. The rural electric cooperatives that make up the mem-



bership of KEPCo provide retail electricity and other services to an estimated 95,000 consumer meters. In addition to farms and rural homes, KEPCo members serve an array of

business and industrial sites. KEPCo, based in Topeka, has a power supply resource consisting of a 6 percent ownership stake in the Wolf Creek Generating Station and long-term purchase contracts for power from federal hydro generating plants in the region. The balance of member power requirements are purchased from regional utilities as needed.

Charles Terrill serves as KEPCo's Executive Vice President and Chief Executive Officer. He and his twenty-member staff carry out KEPCo's day-to-day operating requirements and other activities as directed by its Board of Trustees. "KEPCo and its members are concerned with the vitality of rural Kansas. Rural electric cooperatives are often one of the most visible enterprises in a region, and can easily become the strength of a rural development ef-

fort," says Terrill.

Loren Medley, Economic Development and Marketing Coordinator for KEPCo, will serve as the PRIDE sponsor representative. Medley is excited about becoming involved with the PRIDE Program and says, "We believe that organizations like PRIDE enhance the quality of life for Kansas citizens. In addition, an active community extends a favorable impression to potential residents and to a business or industry which may be considering the location for expansion or relocation. A community that has capitalized on its strengths and can market them effectively has a significant advantage in the competitive arena of economic development. Support of important programs like PRIDE is good for the entire state of Kansas and for KEPCo."
